Matching Letter, Words and Pictures

Dear Parents/Guardians:

This sheet can be used in several ways to help your child learn to read and write. For example:

- 1. Cut them all out. Lay the first group of pictures out and get your child to listen for the first sound and put the appropriate letter under the picture.
- 2. This can be reversed and the letters can be put down first for your child to match the pictures to the first sounds. As the year progresses, your child may have to listen for middle or final sounds
- 3. The words can be put down for your child to blend the sounds, read the words and put the appropriate picture underneath.
- 4. To encourage independent writing, lay the pictures out for your child to draw. Then have your child write the words underneath, by listening for the sounds and writing the letters. This is the process we use for writing in our journals. The children are also given a small page with all the letters and pictures of all the Jolly Phonics sounds to help them with their writing.
